Union Dues for 2016

Amendments to Article IX of the IBEW Constitution, approved at the 38th IBEW International Convention, state that all dues payments covering January 2016 to December 2016 will increase three dollars (\$3.00) per quarter. Therefore, dues payments for 2016 will be **\$103.50 per quarter**, due and payable during the first month of each quarter.

You can also pay ahead either:

1 Quarter (3 Months)	=	\$ 103.50
½ Year (6 Months)	=	\$ 207.00
¾ Year (9 Months)	=	\$ 310.50
Full Year (12 Months)	=	\$ 414.00

While zealously pursuing his 5th year of apprenticeship with Local 43, his renal failure progressed, he was unable to continue working and his medical insurance became depleted.


